

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS NEAR OLD DOMINION DRIVE BRIDGE IN MCLEAN

Daytime Pile Driving for New Bridge to Start on or About
Friday, October 27 and Continue for Approximately One Month

I-495 Express Lanes Northern Extension (495 NEXT) Project

What's Happening?

During daytime hours, two phases of pile driving will occur for the east side abutment of the future Old Dominion Drive Bridge over I-495:

1. Starting on or about Friday, October 27 and continuing for an estimated 10 business days, piles will be driven around the future abutment to support the future bridge foundation while the location is excavated, and part of the abutment is constructed.
2. After a break of approximately one week to complete the above-mentioned excavation and construction, pile driving will resume in mid-November and continue for an estimated five business days.

What Should Neighbors Expect?

Pile driving involves hammering steel piles into the ground to support the foundation of the future bridge. When active, neighbors will hear hammer strikes every few seconds. Pile driving will occur only during daytime hours, Monday through Friday.

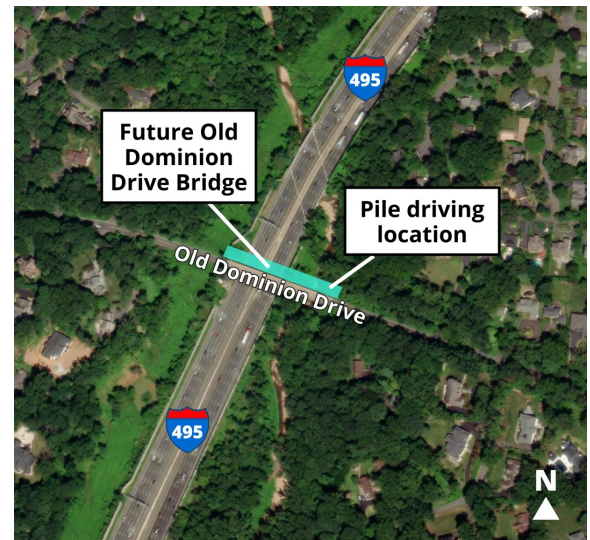
This construction work is weather dependent, and may be rescheduled if needed.

What Happens Next?

In late 2023 or early 2024, crews will drive piles at the west abutment of the future Old Dominion Drive Bridge.

Subsequent work will include completing the abutments and relocating utility lines. Next, bridge beams will be lifted into place over the Beltway, an activity that must be performed during nighttime hours so the highway below can be closed to traffic for safety reasons. The deck and remaining elements of the bridge then will be constructed.
